Investigation into the death of James LIN, Court Ref: 2016 000350

Thank you for providing a copy of the finding referenced above and received on 8 January 2018.

Life Saving Victoria's mission is to prevent aquatic related death and injury in all Victorian communities and has the vision that all Victorians will learn water safety, swimming and resuscitation, and be provided with safe aquatic environments and venues.

Please find below Life Saving Victoria's response to the following recommendations:

Recommendation 1: "That Victoria Police liaise with Life Saving Victoria, local lifesaving clubs, and other stakeholders, for the purpose of establishing the Mornington Peninsula surf safety working group."

Life Saving Victoria Response;

The Coroner's recommendation has been implemented, with the Mornington Peninsula Surf Safety Working Group (MPSSWG) holding its first meeting at the Gunnamatta Surf Life Saving Club on Wednesday 28 February 2018.
