I note that Whittlesea Community Legal Service, representing WCC Inc., liaised at length with Coroner Jamieson in relation to the matters of Ms WX; Ms TP; Ms YN; and Ms MH above, findings of which were handed down by Coroner Jamieson in September 2020. Among the recommendations made by Her Honour, was a recommendation that: -

With the aim of promoting public health and safety and preventing like deaths, I recommend that the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services review current services that support the health and wellbeing of South Asian women

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in the City of Whittlesea, and consult with relevant service providers and other stakeholders, to identify opportunities to improve South Asian women's access to and engagement with such services.

With a view to seeking confirmation that the Secretary would consult with our group, which has been working upon these issues, the 'Crossroads Group', there was an exchange of correspondence between Secretary Peake and myself, and subsequently Secretary Wallace and myself, culminating in a letter from Secretary Wallace, giving his imprimatur on a consultation with us. As a result, I am satisfied that Secretary Wallace has complied with the letter and the spirit of Her Honour's recommendation.

I would be grateful if you would file this letter together with the enclosed correspondence to stand as a record of our view that the Secretary's efforts have been satisfactory in this regard.

I refer to previous correspondence with you regarding the matter of the Death of presently overseen by Coroner Olle.

I confirm your previous advice of Coroner Olle's direction that The **Investigation** into the death of is effectively on hold until Coroner Jamieson has completed Her Honour's Findings.
